FUNERAL Sharing the Moment

The Catholic Funeral Rites in the Order of Christian Funerals is a celebration of faith that enables loved ones and the community to mourn by focusing on the promise of everlasting life and the hope of Resurrection in Christ.

Three distinct rites are provided at the time of the funeral: the Vigil, Funeral Liturgy and Committal Service. Each rite plays a unique part in our grieving process. Woven into the context of these funeral rites is an abundance of Catholic symbols and metaphors that convey the dramatic journey from baptism to redemption through Christ.

Vigil & Visitation

The Vigil is often the first time family, friends and members of the community gather in remembrance of a treasured life, for prayer and support. You may celebrate in your Parish, Funeral Center or your home.

Funeral Liturgy

The Funeral Mass is the principle celebration of the Christian Funeral. It is the memorial of Christ's sacrifice and Resurrection and is a reminder that we are one with Christ in life, death and Resurrection. It is here that family and friends join to reaffirm the belief that life has not ended.

Committal

The Committal is the final service and time of interment. Here, family and friends gather to take their final leave with the comfort and promise of Resurrection.

CREMATION

Embracing New Traditions

Cremation is a practice that has been accepted by the Catholic Church for over 50 years.

For those choosing cremation, the Catholic funeral tradition affords sacred and beautiful rituals that bring comfort to loved ones. There are two options when choosing to have a church service that are beautiful expressions of faith and reverence:





Help with Every Detail

- Free interment option for cremated remains with our All Souls Remembrance Program.
- We suggest that you plan in advance for your funeral and cemetery arrangements.
- Reduce the stress on your family, keep expenses manageable and allow family and friends the opportunity to gather at an important time.

What is the Church's Position on Cremation?

While there is a preference for traditional burial, as Christ was buried in the tomb, the Church has permitted cremation for over 50 years. Cremation should respect the human body and belief in the Resurrection.

When Should the Cremation Occur?

The preference is for cremation to occur following the funeral liturgy so that the body can be present for the vigil and funeral services. However, it is possible to have a memorial service with the cremated remains present.

What is the Proper Handling of Cremated Remains?

The Church teaches that cremated remains should be kept together (not scattered or divided) to respect the body as the temple of the Holy Spirit and preferably interred in the consecrated grounds of a Catholic Cemetery.

What Does the Cemetery Offer?

Our cemeteries are sacred places for the living to memorialize their loved ones, with a variety of burial choices including personalized glass front niches and beautiful cremation burial sites. Financial concerns should never stop one from choosing a place of permanent remembrance. As such, we provide free of charge to people of all faiths, the dignified placement of cremated remains with our All Souls Remembrance Program.



The death of a child is unimaginable for any family, and for those who have suffered this great loss; it is the ultimate tragedy and forever life changing. The CFCS Precious Lives program provides caring cemetery financial support to families who have suffered the tremendous loss of a child.

CFCS Precious Lives Program

Faith Based

Our mission programs are focused on our faith, traditions, families and the community, providing caring and compassionate services to all those in need. "Blessed are those who mourn, for they shall be comforted" Matthew 5:4

Mission & Ministry

The CFCS Precious Lives Child Burial Program is a charitable mission program designed to alleviate almost all of the major cemetery expenses a family who suffered the loss of a child will face. CFCS will provide basic cemetery services in the Child Burial Section, allowing the family to focus on faith, grief and their family during this incredibly difficult time.

Community Hospital Resource

In addition to serving families, this program also assists hospitals by providing sacred interment of an unborn child at any of our Catholic Cemeteries.

All SOULS REMEMBRANCE PROGRAM

Free Interment of Cremated Remains

CFCS offers at no charge, to anyone, of any faith, who has cremated remains at home or is considering scattering, a dignified committal of the remains at any of our cemeteries. The committal will occur at the All Souls Remembrance Crypt and then the remains will be permanently interred within the consecrated grounds of a Catholic Cemetery.

Highlights of the Program

- Free placement in the Remembrance Crypt available at any of our cemeteries
- A committal service from the Order of Christian Funerals
- A permanent recordation of interment as well as an optional cenotaph for memorialization
- Remains always stay within consecrated grounds
- Open to all funeral homes

FAMILY HERITAGE PROGRAM

Burial Within an Existing Site

This unique program allows for graves, crypts or niches already owned by families to be transformed into a family estate. Depending on the grave, crypt or niche selected, a number of cremated remains can typically be added.

The plot will serve as a family's final gathering place, allowing family members who have lived apart to be together on their final journey, as well as be a place that generations can come to remember their ancestors. With this program we maximize the use of space and minimize the cost to families.

Frequently Asked Questions:

How many cremated remains are allowed in an existing location?

Depending on the size of the existing grave, crypt or niche, a number of cremated remains can be added.


How can I be memorialized?

Space permitting multiple family members can have their names inscribed on the monument or crypt.* When the number of inscriptions exceeds what is feasible or permitted, cenotaphs are available as well as bronze plaques which will be placed near the final resting place.

Can I use a crypt or a niche?

Yes, crypts, grave and niches are eligible to be used with the Family Heritage Program.

* Certain cemetery sections and mausoleums have a prescribed number of inscriptions allowed per space.
